
Student Guidelines for Preventing the Spread of Infectious Disease (for Distribution)

1. Actively take part in prevention activities.

- A. Be mindful of and strictly abide by prevention guidelines provided by UST (refer to documents issued by the Korea Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, its website, etc.).
- B. Keep your masks on at all times, use hand sanitizer, and maintain good personal hygiene.
- C. Refrain from holding school events and group activities, such as club gatherings and Homecoming Day.
- D. Immediately report any student who has recently traveled abroad among your close contacts to UST Student Affairs Team and campus coordinator.
- E. Actively cooperate with social distancing policies.

2. Any of the following students must report to the person in charge at UST Student Affairs Team and Campus coordinator.

- A. Those subject to COVID-19 reporting requirements (e.g., confirmed patients, suspected patients, patients under investigation showing symptoms, and the contacts of such people).
- B. Those who have undergone COVID-19 testing.
- C. International who recently came to Korea from abroad or students who live with someone who recently came to Korea from abroad.
- D. Those who visited or are associated with COVID-19 outbreak regions.
- E. Those with a fever or respiratory symptoms of unknown cause.
- F. Those who were ordered to telecommute due to COVID-19 outbreaks within their campus.
- G. Those who live with confirmed patients or those who are self-quarantining.

3. Any of the following students must report to the UST Student Affairs Team and campus coordinator and must stop going to school as defined by their respective campuses.

- A. Those who live with someone who recently came to Korea from abroad.
- B. Those who live with confirmed COVID-19 patients or those who received a self-quarantine order from their community health center.
- C. Those who visited or are associated with COVID-19 outbreak regions.
- D. Those who are not subject to COVID-19 reporting but show COVID-19 symptoms of an unknown cause should not go to school until they have been symptom-free for more than three to four days.

4. Any of the following students must report to the UST Student Affairs Team and campus coordinator and must engage in self-monitoring for 14 days as defined by their respective campuses.

- A. Those whose movement paths overlap with those of a COVID-19 confirmed patient but who are not deemed to be a close contact of a COVID-19 confirmed patient and have no COVID-19 clinical manifestations.
- B. Those whose movement paths overlap with those of a COVID-19 confirmed patient but are not deemed to be a close contact of a COVID-19 patient and tested negative for COVID-19.

*** Please note that the definitions and guidelines for stopping going to school and self-monitoring are subject to change.**
